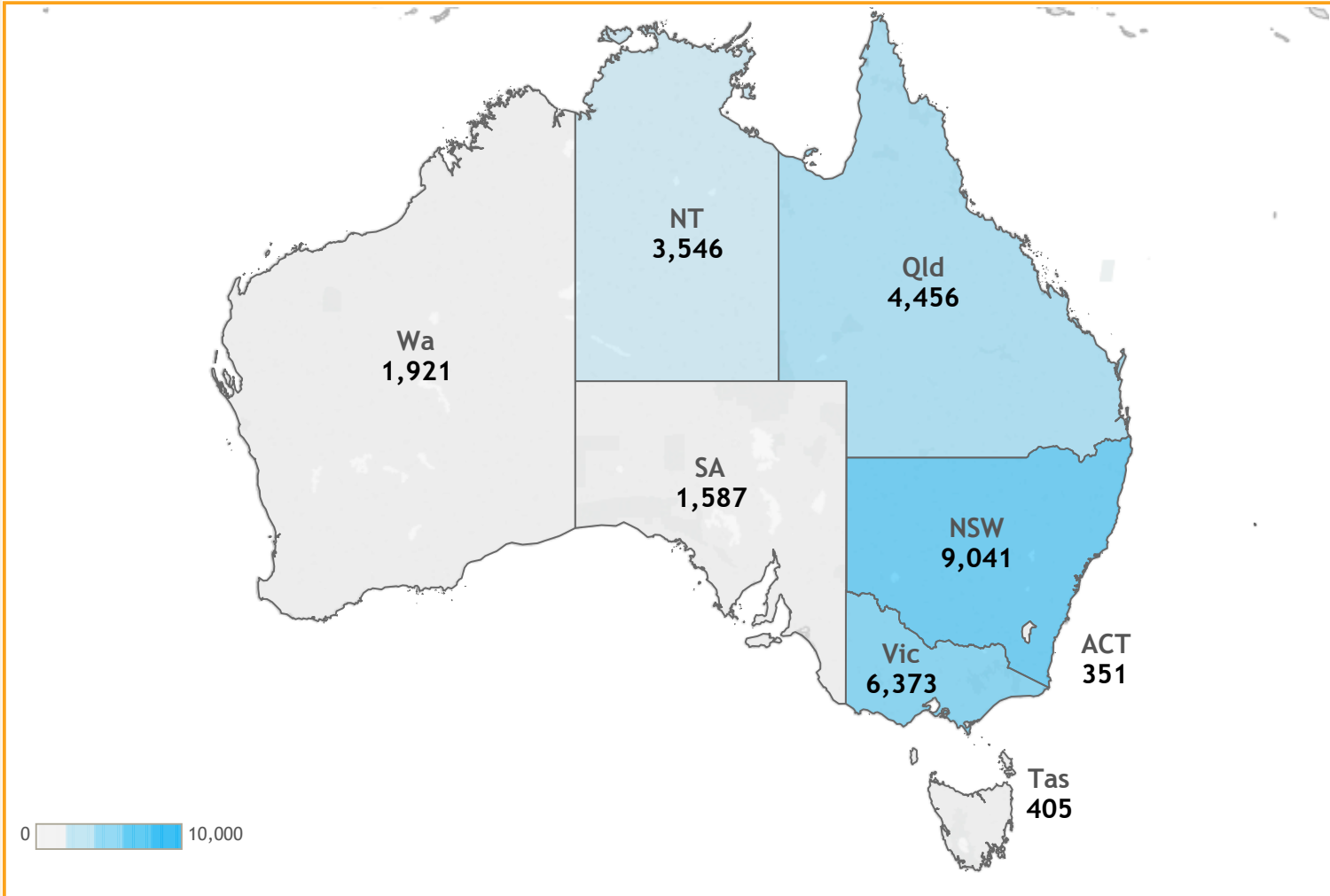


# Youth Homelessness Matters Day 2019



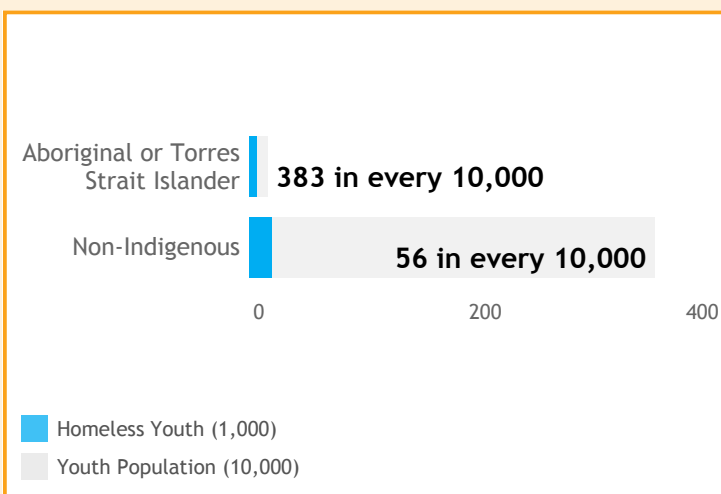
## Almost 28,000 young people (aged 12-24) are homeless on any given night in Australia

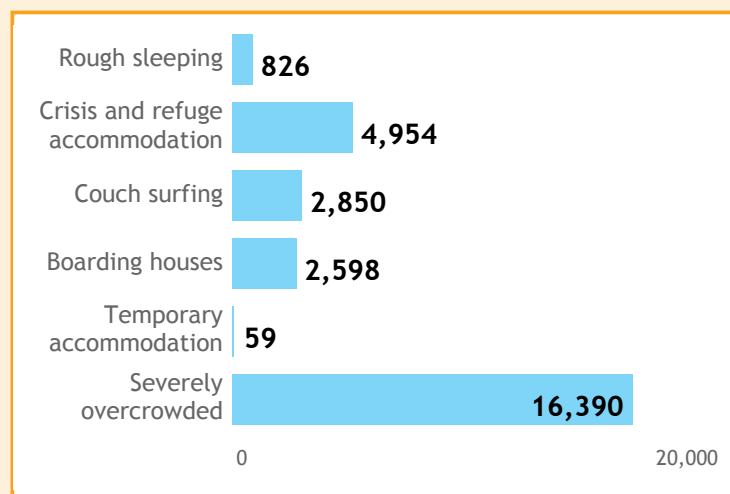
## Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander youth are seven times more likely to be homeless than other young people (aged 12-24)

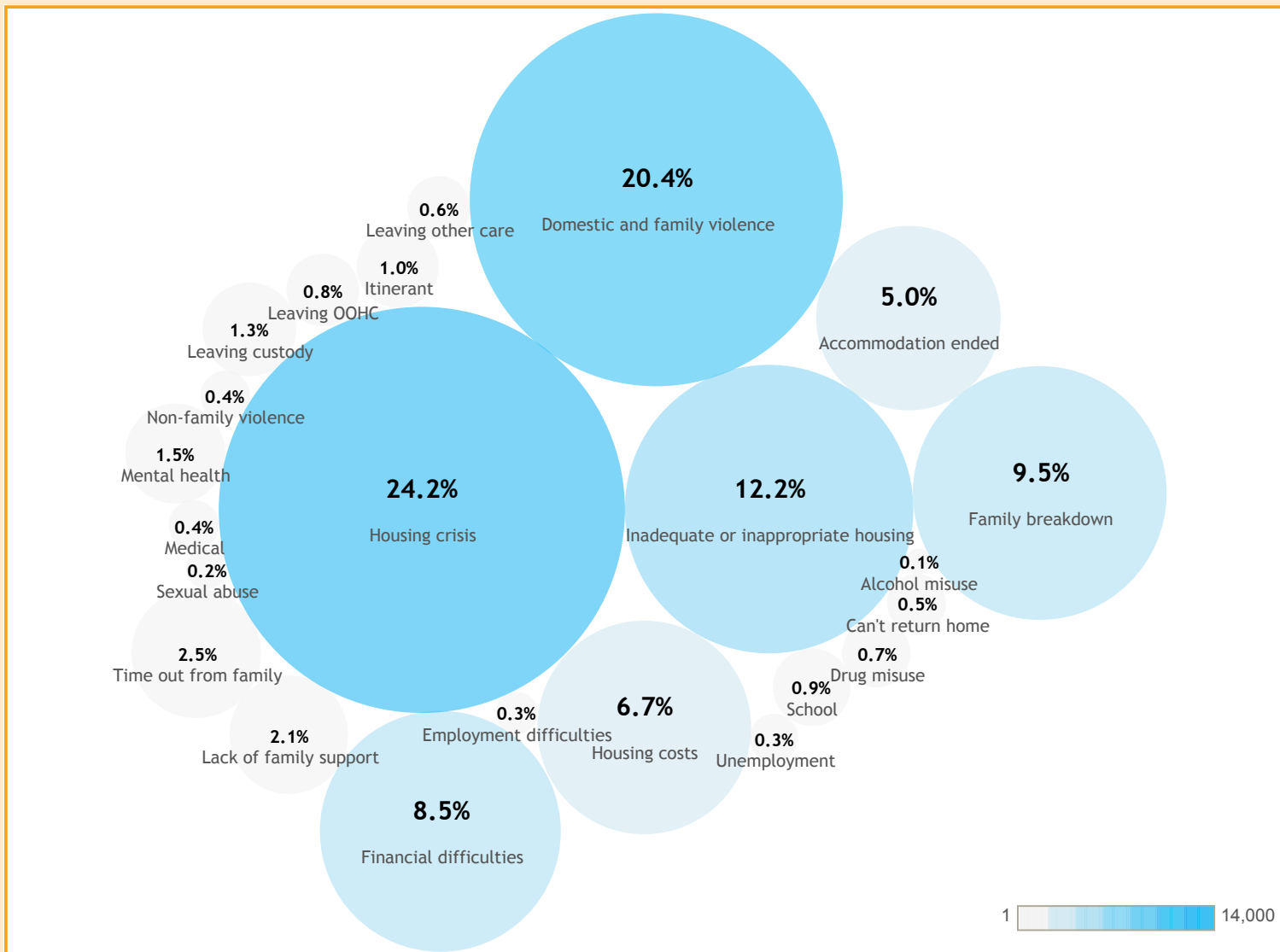
## Severe overcrowding is the most common type of homelessness among young people (aged 12-24)

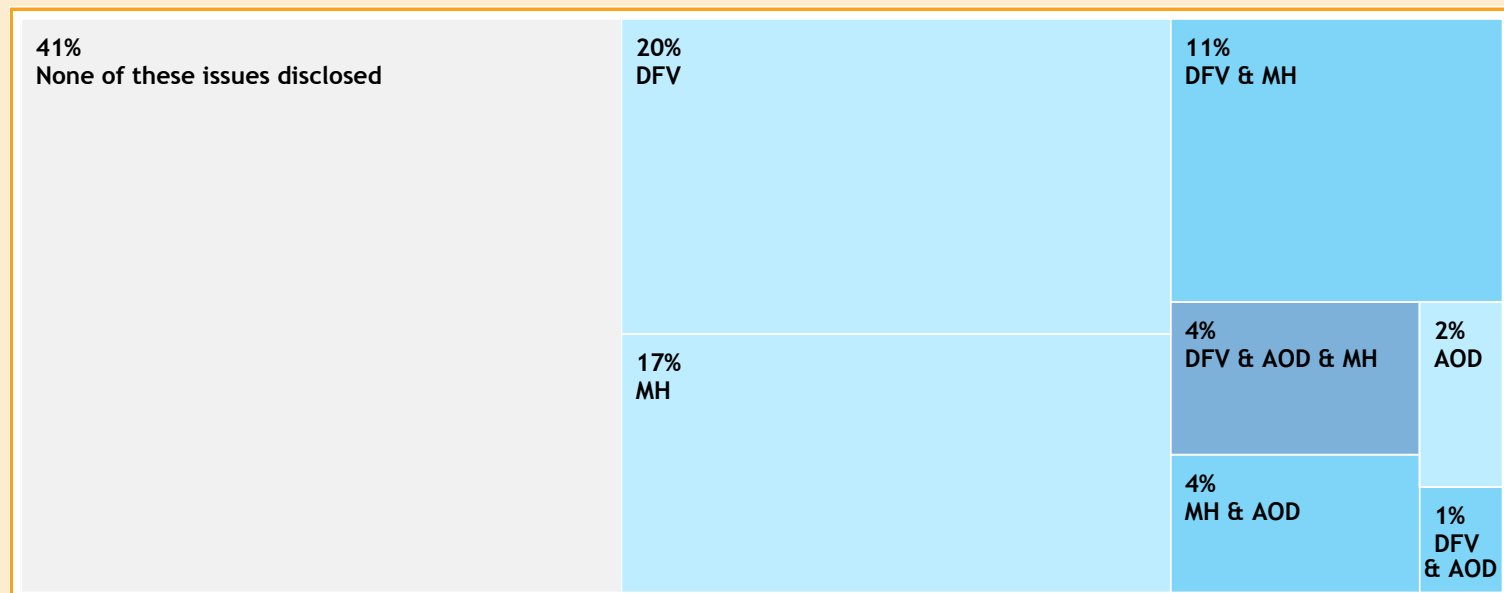
# Housing crisis and domestic and family violence are the most common primary reasons young people (aged 15-24) access homelessness services
